- ✓ OSHA 1910.179 requires that only Designated and Qualified people may operate overhead cranes.
- ✓ OSHA 1926.1427 requires the employer to ensure that each operator is trained, certified, licensed, and evaluated.
- ✓ OSHA referenced industry standard ASME B30.2 requires owners to provide both classroom and hands on training to all operators. Including both a written and practical examination.
- ✓ CMAA says that it is the responsibility of the crane owner to establish programs to train and designate qualified crane operators.
- ✓ OSHA 1910.179 says adjustments, repairs and inspections on cranes can only be performed by designated and qualified personnel
- ✓ ASME B30.2 says training and certification of all personal who inspect or maintain the electrical, mechanical, or structural components of a crane, is required
- ✓ OSHA 1910.184 says only designated and competent people can perform sling pre shift inspections. Designated is defined as qualified. How can someone be qualified without training?
